Reflecting on the learning issues as a teaching and learning tool, I recall they were initially an unusual concept to grasp ("I ask my own question and answer it too?"). However they proved to be a useful tool, very aligned with adult learning principles. Having completed them, I would definitely consider using them where applicable, in any future work in teaching and assessment.

4.50 Learning Issues was a good way to think independently on issues that interest me.

Overall I have enjoyed this unit because I have felt challenged. I had a lot to learn and had to be self-directed to do so. **Student comment** ".....when asked to design a MCQ for the class I think I spent about 10 minutes creating two questions. When the questions were then analyzed by the group I was surprised at how inadequate they were. The discussion that followed about how to create useful and effective MCQs was very enlightening. This was also the case for the short essay question created by another student. Initially the question looked fine but on further analysis it was evident that the question was open to interpretation, possibly ambiguous and may not have been the best test question. I found the "dissecting" of these examples and excellent way to learn how to create an adequate question for an assessment tool". **Student feedback** In the online discussions it was good to sit outside the square so to speak and get insight into potential difficult situations, both from a teacher and learner perspective. It gave the opportunity to discuss and "nut out" real scenarios in a nonconfrontational setting and hone your personal skills and attitudes of very possible issues that one may be faced with in a similar set up. **Student feedback**
